This Week's Class: The Beatitudes

This weeks class is about the Beatitudes. Jesus' teaching known as the Sermon on the Mount appears in Matthew's and Luke's Gospels. The sermon contains three chapters and more than 100 verses. The sermon begins with the Beatitudes, after which Jesus teaches about a series of issues related to human behavior. The behavior issues included things such as anger or retaliation. His teachings show us that things such as pride, anger, or revenge will not get us into the Kingdom of Heaven.

As God's children, it is in our nature to have a void that longs for God's love. We know that we need Him but we try to fill that void with false gods. Thomas Aquinas named these as **wealth**, **pleasure**, **power**, **and honor**. These things that are less than God can turn into addiction because we try to replace God with those substitutes and we are always wanting more.

"Blessed are the poor in spirit; for theirs is the kingdom of heaven" Many misinterpret this as judgement for those who are wealthy, but that is not the case. Jesus wants us to ask ourselves: How blessed are we, if we are not attached to material things?

Thomas Aquinas said **"If you want the perfect exemplification of the Beatitudes look to Christ Crucified"**. May we look at the cross and see that Jesus did not have neither wealth, pleasure, power, nor honor. Jesus has detached himself from the four things we often seek for joy. Jesus crucified is the perfect example of true freedom!
